



CUTTING FROM SCRAPS

1 Place all of your fabric pieces right side up on your cutting surface to match the illustration on the template set. Placing the fabrics face down will result in mirror image blocks.

2 Whenever possible align the template edge that will be along the outside edge of the block with the straight or crosswise grain of the fabric. Use the icons printed on the templates to identify which side(s) should be on the straight of grain. Cutting on the grain line is not required, but it will keep the bias edges contained within the block.

3 Take care to trim the blunt ends of the template carefully. The blunt tips are designed to make the block assembly easier.




6 Stitch the units together along the angled edge matching the ends and the raw edges. You have pre-trimmed the dog-ears so that the angled seam matches perfectly. Press the seam to one side.

4 Arrange the fabric pieces to make the shape of the block according to the layout diagram printed on the templates.


5 Stitch the A piece to the B piece positioning the A piece so that the straight of grain side will be along the outside edge of the block. Stitch the C and D pieces together as shown. Press the seams toward the darker fabric.

The 1/2 inch white grid lines printed on the templates can be used to align the fabric print or stripes, if desired.





Your block will measure 6 1/2 inches including seam allowance.
